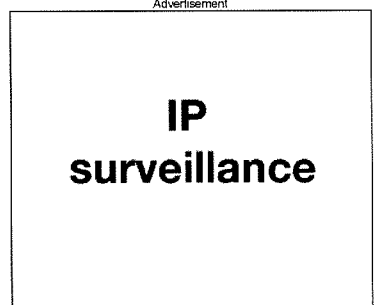
TAB Systems launches new multimodal biometric recognition unit

The unit can be integrated with an array of additional features like video messaging, intercom and surveillance. Completely protocol independent, it can be used to control almost any kind of external I/O device, according to the company.

The new Diadem features a built-in IR CCTV camera and IR LED lights that offer identification in all lighting conditions. The unit also has an 8-inch color touch screen, a motion detector, microphone, Intel Centrino processor, built-in storage and internal memory. The integrated communication ports and relay I/O controller can be used to control lights, electronic locks, alarms, sensors and other electrical devices.
